#### "The Power of Water: Greensboro's Life Blood Yesterday and Today"

#### Sunday, March 6th, 2 p.m. at Fellowship Hall

The brooks and rivers in town affected how the town was settled because the early residents needed running water to power their mills.

They were located in Greensboro Village, as well as in North Greensboro. In the early 1800s, Greensboro boasted three sawmills, two grist mills, one oat mill, one shingle mill, one carding machine, and one fulling mill (for the thickening, cleaning and shrinking of cloth).

Greensboro Bend began when mill owners lured the builders of the railroad to make a 'bend' in the route with a bond of \$18,000 posted by the town of Greensboro and private citizens.



A steam mill was built in 1869 near the intersection of Route 16 and North Greensboro Road, just after the contract for the new railroad had been let out. Steam mills could be powered by burning scrap lumber and operate year-round.



John Mackin and Nat Smith will tell about the Village System (Greensboro Fire District # 1) and Ernest Machia will speak about the Greensboro Bend System (Bend Fire District # 2).

The Village system was recently reconstructed, as everyone remembers when the traffic was slowed during the past two years as new pipes were laid.John is Chair and Water Operator of the Prudential Committee of Greensboro Fire District # 1, and Nat Smith is Clerk of the Prudential Committee. Ernest Machia is Chairman of the Greensboro Bend Prudential Board of Fire District # 2.

B. Each application must be made by the owner in writing of the real estate upon which the supply of water is desired, who will be held responsible for all water rates and charges.

5. Service Pipes.-Service pipes will be provided and maintained by the Water Company to the side line of the street.

A.—No service pipe will be laid or water furnished for less than eight dollars a year for each service.
6. Pipes and Fixtures.—A.—All pipes and fixtures must be examined and approved by the board or its agents before water is supplied to them.

B.-Notice of all alterations and additions must be given to the board before they are put in use.

C.—The pipes and fixtures must be kept in good order and repairs made whenever required by the board.
7. No person supplied with the water shall allow its use for any other purpose than that stated in the application.
The water must not be left running to prevent freezing, or kept running at any time longer than necessary for proper use, unless otherwise provided for by the board.

8. The use of hose or washing automobiles will not be allowed without persmission of the directors.

9. Stoppage.—The Board and its agent will have the right to stop the water from any pipe for repairs or other purpose without notice. No allowance will be made for such stoppage.

10. Abatements.—A discount for vacancies, if not less than two months, will be allowed, provided written notice is given to the Water Commissioners at the time of vacancy and re-occupation.

11. Penalties.—For violation of or failure to comply with any of the foregoing regulations, including, payment by any water taken, the Board may order the water shut off from such service, although two or more parties may receive water through the same pipe. If shut off for such reason the water will not be turned on again, except for upon full compliance with the regulations and the payment of one dollar.

12. Reservations.—The Water Commissioners reserve the right to change the foregoing rates and regulations at any time, and to make such variations from the foregoing rates in special cases as the amount of water used in any case may render just and nevessary.

I have a copy of your letter to Mr. Stegner, which seems to close the transaction between the Stegners and the Fire District with the exception of my bill. As you have requested, I have enclosed an itemized statement for your payment.

I cannot close this matter without observing that in ten years of practice I have never, in a real estate transaction,

encountered such testiness and quarrelsomeness on the part of a buyer. The point that you make in the March 18 letter regarding the date is simply incorrect. I enclose a copy of the lower left-hand corner of the map which I received from either you or Mr. Stegner. You will note the rubber stamp at the very bottom which indicates June 15, 1973. Since the stamp is the more specific, I simply put that date in for accuracy sake.

The main oversight and inaccuracy in this whole transaction has been in your instruction to me regarding the accurate name of the buyer of this property.

You failed to indicate that you had made that error until you extracted from me a promise not to charge the Fire District any more money for redrafting the deed and other papers.

I am very sorry that this transaction has apparently aggravated you, but I think that your attitude has no real basis. I will appreciate your sending me the Fire District's check for my enclosed statement as soon as possible.
